Latest on the Practice of Groundwater Remediation for Chlorinated Solvents

Chlorinated solvents are still some of the most common contaminants in the remediation industry due to widespread use, persistence in the environment, and remediation difficulty. The science and practice of remediation of chlorinated solvents has evolved and improved considerably in 30 years. From only pump and treat in the 1980s, it has evolved to the suite of technologies we now have available (such as in situ oxidation, in situ chemical reduction, enhanced bioremediation, thermal treatment, and soil mixing with ZVI). This presentation will provide a summary of the current state-of-the-practice in chlorinated solvent remediation with case study
